DETAILS: The Student Services Complex is made up of two buildings – a two-story Student

Services Building and a one-story Student Services Annex.

The complex combines all Student Services functions into one area of the campus. It is home to the college's Associated Student Union, International Student Services Office, Veterans Student Services, Outreach & Recruitment Office, the Assessment Center, Services for Students with Disabilities (formerly Disabled Students Programs and Services), Extended Opportunity Program and Services Office, TRiO/Student Services Office, Upward Bound Office and the

Student Services administrative offices.

GREEN FEATURES:

The complex was designed to meet LEED sustainability standards and includes these features:

- A cool roof that reduces heat
- CO2 monitoring
- Low-emission construction and building materials that reduce impacts to air quality
- Optimized energy performance
- Processes and materials that will reduce water usage by 20 percent
- The use of some recycled and locally manufactured building materials

In addition, nearly 75 percent of construction waste was diverted from landfills during the building process.

Valley College is also easy to reach from the campus' stop on the Los Angeles Metro Orange Line.
