The new 84,000 square foot Academic Complex 1 (AC1) will reorientate the face of Los Angeles Valley College.

Located along Burbank Boulevard, the new three-story building will comprise of two wings joined by a common lobby and include 24 classrooms, 4 flexible classrooms, 6 computer labs, 1 Skills Demonstration and Testina Room. 1 Lecture Administration suite with offices and support spaces for faculty and staff. The new building will the house Administration, CSIS, Emergency Services, Mathematics, Psychology/Statistics and Sociology/Ethnic Studies departments.

Academic Complex 1 will enhance the College's historic quad with the addition of a terraced garden, planetarium court, and roundabout arroyo. Designed above the storm water capture system, these outdoors areas will create inviting spaces for the students to gather, share and study. The project includes a number of sustainability features for energy efficiency, water conservation, and incorporates sustainable building materials.

Founded in 1949, Los Angeles Valley College is located in the heart of the San Fernando Valley and offers over 160 associate degrees programs and certificate programs. The campus is an urban oasis containing over 1,600 trees and was the first community college in California to be recognized as a Tree Campus USA.
