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The Student Union Cafeteria Buildout will enable full-service food options on the first floor of the existing Student Union, realizing the whole campus concept to support student success. More than 7,000 square feet will be transformed to provide an exhibition kitchen, secondary prep kitchen, dry storage pantry and a walk-in freezer to optimize hot food and grab-n-go options for students, faculty and visitors. Daily menu food options from the deli/grill, pizza/pasta bar, salad bar and a global themed food bar will change weekly.

The new dining area will feature a mixture of 4 and 6 top tables that may be re-configured to meet the needs of groups varying in size. In addition, the area may be converted into a lecture hall with full audio visual capabilities and seat capacity for up to 114 people. These new facilities will offer a place for students, staff, faculty, and community groups to meet, host events, eat, socialize, study, and relax.

Sustainability features will include energy efficient cooking equipment and LED lighting throughout the cafeteria and dining spaces. The project will also improve ADA accessibility to and from the building.

Founded in 1929, LACC, the oldest of Los Angeles' Community Colleges, opened its doors as Los Angeles Junior College and changed to its current name in 1938. Today, LACC provides a dynamic and innovative learning environment, offering more than 100 vocational and professional programs, including degrees, transfer programs, and certificates to more than 18,000 students.
